


Dear Parents and Carers,



#### What is Roblox?

Roblox is a platform consisting of a collection of games. Players can either create games or play games that other users have created. It is free to download (however subscription options and in game/app purchases are available) and can be played across numerous devices. A lot of the content is user generated, which may mean not all games will be suitable for your child to view/play. If your child is playing Roblox, it is important to monitor what your child is accessing and set up appropriate parental controls.

PEGI rate Roblox with a Parental Guidance label, this is because it is difficult to rate due to the huge level of user generated content.



#### What should I be aware of?

**Game content** – as mentioned, users create games so the content/themes may not be appropriate for your child.

**Chat Facility** - Players can chat to each other. You can turn communication off completely or add restrictions, such as only communicate with friends.

Virtual Currency - Players can buy Robux (their virtual currency) to buy ingame upgrades or accessories.



#### **Roblox accounts with Parental privileges - NEW**

Roblox have just launched a new system to manage your child's experience on Roblox through 'Roblox accounts with parent privileges.' The new format allows you to view and update parental controls from your own device. Controls include setting content restrictions, managing screen time and setting a spending limit. ## **Highway Hullabaloo**

A busy highway between two Chinese cities became blocked with nearly 100,000 cyclists earlier this month! The riders were travelling from Zhenghou to Kaifeng to try some special dumplings, as part of a social media trend called the 'Night Ride to Kaifeng'. Guantangbao are delicious dumplings, filled with warm, tasty soup, and are a local favourite in Kaifeng. The bicycle frenzy started with just four friends, who decided to rent bikes and cycle to Kaifeng to taste the famous dumplings. As more and more people joined, the streets became crowded and blocked with bikes. One of the original four friends said, 'You don't get a second chance at youth, so you must go for a spontaneous trip with friends.' While it caused a bit of chaos, it was certainly an exciting adventure for everyone involved!

#### **Whale Rescue!**

A humpback whale, that became tangled in fishing ropes, has been set free in Loch Fyne, Scotland. The poor whale had ropes wrapped around its body and head, making it hard for it to swim. A team from British Divers Marine Life Rescue (BDMLR) rushed to help. Using underwater cameras, they saw how tightly the ropes were caught around the whale. 'It was a tricky job, but we're thrilled to see the whale swim away safely,' said BDMLR rescuer Sarah Collins. The team carefully untangled the





#### **Bells Ring Out!**

Notre Dame Cathedral, in Île de la Cité, Paris, is due to reopen on 8th December. It has been restored following a fire that destroyed a lot of the historic building in 2019. Earlier this month, people were overjoyed to hear the bells ringing out across the city for the first time in five years! Chimes from the cathedral's northern belfry were heard by thousands. The eight bells rang as part of a technical test. Three of the bells are new (pictured right), including the recently-gifted 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games bell. This special bell rang out during the Games

### **Application for Reception Places**

We're now starting the process for entry into reception at primary and infant schools, from the start of the new academic year in September 2025. The application portal is now live for parents/carers to submit their school preferences at <a href="https://www.westnorthants.gov.uk/admissions">www.westnorthants.gov.uk/admissions</a>.

Parents have until 15 January 2025 to apply, with online applicants being notified by email on the national offer day – 16 April 2025. Paper applicants will be notified by letter which will be posted out on offer day. Any application forms received by School Admissions *after* 15 January will be considered as late and won't be considered until May 2025 onwards.

Parents/guardians are encouraged to apply <u>online</u> and read the online prospectus - *Applying for a Primary School Place for 2025-26.* This provides detailed information on schools and the application process.




